## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE BY THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION OF A SWIMMING POOL IN THE CITY OF CHELSEA.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan district commission is hereby  
2 authorized and directed to construct, and thereafter to main-  
3 tain, a swimming pool in the city of Chelsea.

1 SECTION 2. The metropolitan district commission, acting so  
2 far as practicable in consultation with the proper local boards,  
3 may, on behalf of the commonwealth, take by eminent domain  
4 under chapter seventy-nine of the General Laws, in fee or other-  
5 wise, or acquire by purchase, gift or devise, such public or private  
6 lands, water rights, rights of way, easements or other interests  
7 in land as it may deem necessary or desirable for carrying out  
8 the provisions of this act; provided, that nothing in this act  
9 shall be construed to limit existing rights of any city or town  
10 in relation to water supply purposes, or in any way obstruct  
11 such rights.

1 SECTION 3. For said purpose the metropolitan district com-  
2 mission may expend such sums as may be appropriated therefor.
