AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE OPEN PUBLIC INSPECTION OF CIVIL SERVICE
EXAMINATION PAPERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 29 of chapter 31 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out said section as most recently amended
3 by chapter 138 of the acts of 1948, and inserting in place thereof
4 the following section:—

5 *Section 29.* Records of the proceedings of the commission
6 and of the director, all recommendations of applicants and all
7 applications and examination papers, shall be kept on file and
8 shall be open to public inspection. Each application, recom-
9 mendation and examination paper shall be preserved for a period
10 of at least two years, but may be destroyed thereafter.

By order of the House of Representatives, I have signed this bill and caused it to be printed and distributed to the members of the House of Representatives.
