

HOUSE No. 960

By Mr. Flynn of Malden, petition of Maurice R. Flynn, Jr., and another for an amendment to the law relative to the definition of a "lodging house". Mercantile Affairs.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE LETTING OF ROOMS IN A BUILDING TO TWO OR MORE PERSONS SHALL DESIGNATE SUCH BUILDING AS A LODGING HOUSE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by strik-
2 ing out section 22, as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition,
3 and inserting in place thereof the following:—

4 *Section 22.* "Lodging house," as used in section twenty-two
5 to thirty-one, inclusive, shall mean a house where lodgings are
6 let to **[five] two** or more persons not within the second degree
7 of kindred to the person conducting it, and shall not include
8 dormitories or charitable, educational or philanthropic insti-
9 tutions.
