AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF WELLESLEY TO PAY A PENSION
TO WILLIAM O'DONOGHUE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of promoting the public good,
2 the town of Wellesley is hereby authorized to pay William
3 O'Donoghue, an assistant superintendent in the department of
4 public works of said town, who was employed by the town as a
5 laborer and a foreman for over twenty-five years before being
6 promoted to his present position, upon his retirement the pen-
7 sion to which he would have been entitled under section seventy-
8 seven or seventy-seven A of chapter thirty-two of the General
9 Laws as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition if he had con-
10 tinued to be employed as such a foreman until that time.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon acceptance by
2 the town of Wellesley by a vote at a town meeting duly called
3 for that purpose, but not otherwise.
