AN ACT TO PROVIDE LEAVE OF ABSENCE IN CASE OF DEATH OF NEXT  
OF KIN.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 A five-day leave of absence with pay shall be granted a person
- 2 in the employ of the commonwealth, in case of the death of a
- 3 husband, wife, children, parents, brother or sister, without such
- 4 absence being charged against available sick leave credits.

## The Constitution of Massachusetts

## Article I. The Legislature.

Section 1. The legislative power shall be vested in the Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The Senate shall be composed of six members, who shall be chosen by the qualified electors of the Commonwealth.

Section 3. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen by the qualified electors of the Commonwealth, in such manner as the Legislature may direct, so that the number of Representatives shall not exceed one for every five thousand qualified electors.
