AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PAYMENT OF THE EXPENSES AND THE FUNERAL AND BURIAL OF CERTAIN BLIND PERSONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The last paragraph of section 23 of chapter 6 of the General
2 Laws, inserted by chapter 541 of the acts of 1945, is hereby
3 amended by striking out, in line 5, the words "two hundred"
4 and inserting in place thereof the words: — three hundred and
5 fifty.
