### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CANCELLATION OF MOTOR VEHICLE LIABILITY POLICIES OR BONDS IN CERTAIN CASES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 175 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 113J, the following section:—
- 3 *Section 113K.* No insurance company authorized to issue
- 4 motor vehicle liability policies or bonds under the provisions of
- 5 section one hundred and thirteen A of chapter one hundred and
- 6 seventy-five shall cancel such a motor vehicle liability policy
- 7 or bond, including collision coverage, issued to a person, if it
- 8 had issued such policy or bond to said person each year for ten
- 9 consecutive years, except for non-payment of premiums or
- 10 physical disability.

AN ACT TO AMEND AN ACT PASSED IN 1869, RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF DEEDS AND MORTGAGES.

SECTION 1. The following provisions shall be in addition to the provisions of the act aforesaid:

SECTION 2. The register of deeds shall have the honor and precedence of a justice of the peace.

SECTION 3. The register of deeds shall be elected by the qualified voters of the county in which he resides, and shall hold office for a term of four years, and until his successor is elected.

SECTION 4. The register of deeds shall be qualified by the court of probate in the county in which he resides, and shall be sworn to by the court of probate in the county in which he resides.
