AN ACT RELATIVE TO EMPLOYMENT IN MERCANTILE ESTABLISHMENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 56 of chapter 149 of the General Laws, as amended, is
2 hereby further amended by striking out, in line 25, the word
3 "seven" and substituting in place thereof the word: — ten, —
4 and by striking out in line 26, the word "six" as it appears in
5 each instance and substituting in place thereof the word: —
6 eight, — and by striking out, in line 26, the words "four weeks"
7 and substituting in place thereof the words: — five weeks, —
8 and by striking out in lines 27 and 28, the words "and the seventh
9 the Saturday immediately preceding Easter" and substituting
10 in place thereof the words: — and the ninth and tenth in the
11 week immediately preceding Easter, or during the month of
12 January, — all as appearing in chapter three hundred and sixty-
13 eight, acts of nineteen hundred and forty-seven.

of the State of Mississippi, do hereby certify that the following is a true and correct copy of the Constitution of the State of Mississippi, as amended to the 15th day of January, 1892.

ARTICLE I.

SECTION 1. All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in a Senate and House of Representatives, which shall be styled "The Legislature of the State of Mississippi."

SECTION 2. The Senate shall be composed of not more than six members from each county, and not more than one member from each township, to be chosen for the term of four years, to begin on the 1st day of January next after their election, and to continue in office until their successors are chosen.

SECTION 3. The House of Representatives shall be composed of not more than one member from each township, to be chosen for the term of two years, to begin on the 1st day of January next after their election, and to continue in office until their successors are chosen.

SECTION 4. The Legislature shall assemble on the 1st day of January, and shall hold its sessions at the city of Jackson, unless otherwise provided by law.

SECTION 5. The Legislature shall be held in regular session on the 1st day of January, and shall continue in session until the 15th day of March, unless otherwise provided by law.

SECTION 6. The Legislature shall have the power to pass bills to amend the Constitution of this State, and to provide for the election of a convention to meet at such time and place as may be determined by law.
