### AN ACT CLARIFYING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE SUPERANNUATION SECTION OF THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT LAW.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Paragraph (a) of subdivision (2) of section 5 of chapter 32  
2 of the General Laws, as amended by section 6 of chapter 321  
3 of the acts of 1958, is hereby amended by inserting after the  
4 word "member" in line 8 of said paragraph the words: — during  
5 either the last periods of service preceding retirement totalling  
6 five years of creditable service or —

In the following report the Commission on the Organization of the Executive Branch of the Government is pleased to submit to you the results of its study and recommendations.

The Commission was organized by the President in 1947, and its mandate was to study the organization of the Executive Branch of the Government and to report to you on its findings and recommendations.

The Commission has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from interested citizens and officials. It has also conducted extensive research into the various agencies and departments of the Executive Branch.

The Commission believes that the following recommendations will result in a more efficient and economical Executive Branch:

1. The Department of State should be reorganized to eliminate overlapping functions and to improve coordination with other departments.
2. The Federal Bureau of Investigation should be reorganized to improve its efficiency and to reduce its budget.
3. The Federal Reserve Board should be reorganized to improve its independence and to reduce its budget.
