## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty.

AN ACT TO INDEMNIFY THE FORMER REPRESENTATIVE OF THE PORT  
OF BOSTON COMMISSION FOR LOSS OF COMPENSATION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. In order to promote the public service, there is  
2 hereby authorized to be paid from the treasury of the common-  
3 wealth from any appropriation available for the purpose the  
4 sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, representing the loss of  
5 compensation to John H. Carroll, on account of his illegal re-  
6 moval from the position of representative of the port of Boston  
7 commission in nineteen hundred and fifty-four and for further  
8 loss in the ensuing years in violation of his rights under section  
9 sixteen of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
