AN ACT POSTPONING THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF REVISING THE BASIS FOR CERTAIN APPORTIONMENT COSTS RELATIVE TO THE SEWERAGE SYSTEM OF THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 612 of the acts of 1959 is hereby amended by striking
- 2 out section 10 and inserting in place thereof the following sec-

- 4 *Section 10.* This act shall take effect on January first, nineteen
- 5 hundred and sixty-one.
