AN ACT AUTHORIZING CITIES AND TOWNS TO EMPLOY CERTAIN
PERSONS OVER THE AGE OF SEVENTY YEARS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (f) of subdivision (2) of section 3 of chapter 32 of
2 the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the second
3 sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: —
4 No such employee other than an elected official, election officials,
5 part time members of boards or commissions of a city or town
6 or a state official, as defined in section one, shall remain in the
7 service of such governmental unit after attaining the maximum
8 age for the group in which he would have been classified if he
9 had become a member, except under the same conditions which
10 are applicable to a member as set forth in paragraph (e) of this
11 subdivision.

The Constitution of Massachusetts

Article XXXII. The Council and Senate
