By Mr. McIntyre of Quincy, petition of Edward F. Myers for legislation to prohibit the installation of hot water boilers made of steel in certain family dwellings. Public Safety.

AN ACT PROHIBITING THE INSTALLATION OF STEEL HOT WATER
BOILERS IN ONE TO FOUR FAMILY DWELLINGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 142 of the General Laws is hereby amended by in-
- 2 serting after section 17 the following section:—
- 3 *Section 17A.* No boiler made of steel in which hot water is to
- 4 be stored under pressure for heating purposes shall be installed
- 5 in any one family, two family, three family or four family
- 6 dwelling.

AN ACT TO AMEND AN ACT PASSED IN 1871, RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF VOTERS.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 122 of the Acts passed in 1871, entitled "An Act to amend an Act passed in 1870, relative to the registration of voters," is amended so that it shall read as follows:

SECTION 2. No voter shall be entitled to vote in any town or ward, unless he shall be registered as a voter in such town or ward, and shall be so registered at least thirty days before the day of the election.
