AN ACT RELATIVE TO FIRE ALARM BOXES IN CITIES AND TOWNS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Fire alarm boxes in cities and towns shall be  
2 covered with a substance which shall remain on the hands of  
3 the person ringing an alarm for a period of four or five hours.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
