

By Mr. Nagle of Fall River, petition of Harold C. Nagle for reviving and continuing the special commission established to investigate the feasibility of establishing a southeastern Massachusetts water district and other subject matters. Water Supply.

RESOLVE FURTHER REVIVING AND CONTINUING THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO INVESTIGATE AND STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING A SOUTHEASTERN MASSACHUSETTS WATER DISTRICT AND OTHER SUBJECT MATTERS.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission, established by
2 chapter fifty-four of the resolves of nineteen hundred and fifty-
3 one and most recently revived and continued by chapter eighty-
4 eight of the resolves of nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, to
5 investigate and study the advisability and feasibility of estab-
6 lishing a southeastern Massachusetts water district, is hereby
7 further revived and continued for the purpose of further consid-
8 ering that subject, as well as any other subjects or matters
9 heretofore or hereafter referred to it.

10 The commission shall have the power to employ such engi-
11 neers and other assistants, including the procurement of the se rv
12 ices of such consulting engineers, chemists or attorneys as may
13 be necessary, and to incur such expenses as may be necessary
14 for carrying out the provisions of this resolve.

15 Said commission shall be provided with quarters in the state
16 house or elsewhere, may hold hearings, and shall have the power
17 to summon witnesses and to require the production of books,
18 records and papers and the giving of testimony under oath.

19 The commission may expend for the purposes of this resolve
20 the balance available in item 0210-00 of section two of chapter
21 seven hundred and forty-three of the acts of nineteen hundred

22 and fifty-seven, and such other sums as may be appropriated
23 therefor.

24 Said commission shall report fully with plans and estimates to
25 the general court by filing the same with the clerk of the senate
26 on or before May first, nineteen hundred and sixty, including in
27 its report drafts of any legislation recommended by it.
