AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF HULL TO PAY CERTAIN UNPAID BILLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 For the purpose of discharging a moral obligation, the town
2 of Hull is hereby authorized to appropriate money for the pay-
3 ment of, and after such appropriation the treasurer of said town
4 is hereby authorized to pay to David Barry the sum of one hun-
5 dred and twenty-eight dollars, John L. Fleck the sum of one
6 hundred and ninety-two dollars, John Perry the sum of one hun-

8 hundred and twenty-eight dollars, Leo Trubia the sum of one hun-
9 dred and twenty-eight dollars, Elia Mascioli the sum of one
10 hundred and twenty-eight dollars, Americo Colangeli the sum of
11 two hundred and fifty-six dollars, Nazareno DeVito the sum
12 of two hundred and twenty-four dollars, Joseph Bongarzone the
13 sum of two hundred and twenty-four dollars, James Papisodero
14 the sum of two hundred and twenty-four dollars, James Barbuto
15 the sum of two hundred and twenty-four dollars, Richard Del-
16 monico the sum of two hundred and twenty-four dollars, Joseph
17 Elisii the sum of two hundred and fifty-six dollars, for services
18 rendered, and to Samuel Skoler the sum of one hundred and
19 forty-four dollars for materials supplied to said town in the years
20 nineteen hundred and fifty-seven and nineteen hundred and
21 fifty-eight. Said unpaid bills were incurred by the highway de-
22 partment of said town and are legally unenforceable against
23 said town by reason of said services and materials not having
24 been engaged pursuant to provisions of the General Laws and
25 town by-laws and having been incurred in the absence of avail-
26 able appropriations.
