AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE USE OF PRIVATE CONTRACTORS,
CONSULTANTS AND EQUIPMENT BY THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. No contract shall be made by the commonwealth
2 with an independent contractor or consultant for work to be
3 done or services to be rendered where said work or services
4 can be performed by employees of the commonwealth. Each
5 contract signed by the commonwealth with a contractor or
6 consultant must contain the following statement signed under
7 the penalties of perjury: "The work or services called for by
8 this contract cannot be done by the employees of the common-
9 wealth".

1 SECTION 2. The personnel and equipment of private con-
2 tractors shall not be used on state work where state equip-
3 ment and state personnel are available to perform the work.
4 Each contract signed by the commonwealth for the use of pri-
5 vate personnel and private equipment on state work shall con-
6 tain the following statement signed under the penalties of per-
7 jury: "The work or services called for by this contract cannot
8 be performed by state personnel and state equipment".
