By Mr. Bulger, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1049) of William M. Bulger for legislation relative to the salary of special justices. The Judiciary.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Four.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COMPENSATION OF SPECIAL JUDGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the
- 2 rate of compensation for a special justice shall be established
- 3 at one two hundred fiftieth of the salary of the presiding jus-
- 4 tice of each of the respective district courts or seventy-five
- 5 dollars per diem whichever amount shall be the greater.

By Mr. Justice, a petition accompanied by two affidavits, the first of which was sworn to by the petitioner, and the second by a special justice, praying for legislation relative to the salary of special justices of the Superior Court.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COMPENSATION OF SPECIAL JUSTICES.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Connecticut, at the regular session, at the City of Hartford, on the 15th day of May, A. D. 1922.

1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the salary of compensation for a special justice shall be calculated at one hundred thirty of the salary of the presiding justice of each of the respective judicial courts or sessions thereof.
2. The salary of a special justice shall be the greater of the two rates herein provided.
