In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Four.

AN ACT PROHIBITING LEGISLATIVE AGENTS FROM MAKING
POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 6 of Chapter 55, as most recently
2 amended by Chapter 1173 of the Acts of 1973, is hereby
3 further amended by inserting after the word "individual" in
4 the third sentence, the fourth sentence, and the fifth sentence,
5 in each instance, the words: — other than a legislative agent
6 registered under the provisions of Chapter 3, Sections 39
7 through 49 inclusive, as most recently amended by Chapter
8 981 of the Acts of 1973.

1 SECTION 2. Said Section 6 is hereby further amended by
2 inserting after the first paragraph thereof the following new
3 paragraph: —

4 Notwithstanding any provisions of the laws to the contrary,
5 no legislative agent registered under said Sections 39 through
6 49 inclusive of said Chapter 3, shall make any contributions
7 or loan to any elected official, or to any candidate as defined
8 in Section 1 of Chapter 55 or to any political committee.
