
By Mr. Parker, a petition (accompanied by resolve, Senate, No. 58) of John F. Parker that provision be made for an investigation and study by a special commission (including members of the General Court) relative to the practices of the Massachusetts Division of Employment Security in gathering and disseminating unemployment statistics. RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE PRACTICES OF THE MASSACHUSETTS DIVISION OF EMPLOYMENT SECURITY IN GATHERING AND DISSEMINATING UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of two mem-
2 bers of the Senate, three members of the House of Repre-
3 sentatives, and four citizens having expertise in manpower
4 affairs or economics appointed by the Governor is hereby
5 established for the purpose of making an investigation and
6 study relative to the mechanisms employed by the Massachu-
7 setts Division of Employment Security in assembling,
8 analyzing, evaluating, and disseminating information on the
9 number of characteristics of the unemployed in Massachu-
10 setts. Said commission shall report to the General Court the
11 results of its investigation and study by filing with the clerk
12 of the Senate its report on the accuracy and implications of
13 the unemployment statistics disseminated by the Division of
14 Employment Security.
