AN ACT RELATIVE TO PROHIBITING STANDEES ON SCHOOL BUSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 7B of chapter 90 of the General Laws,
2 as most recently amended by chapter 803 of the acts of 1971,
3 is hereby amended by striking out clause (2) and inserting in
4 place thereof the following clause:

5 (2) Each school bus shall contain adequate seating accom-
6 modations for each passenger transported therein, and no
7 passenger shall be allowed to stand while such bus is in motion.

1 SECTION 2. Section 7L of chapter 90 of the General Laws is
2 hereby repealed.
