**AN ACT CHANGING THE LAW RELATIVE TO THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION
OF RADIO AND TELEVISION TECHNIQUES.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 87PPP of chapter 112 of the General
2 Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 47 of the acts of
3 1967, is hereby further amended by inserting after the para-
4 graph defining "Technician License" the following para-
5 graphs:—

6 "Shop License", license issued to any person, firm, corpo-
7 ration or partnership which installs, repairs and maintains an-
8 tenna, radio and television receivers for the public whether it
9 employs technicians or lets out its work to other service organ-
10 izations.

11 "Antenna License", license issued to any person at least
12 eighteen years of age, engaged in the installation, repair and
13 maintenance of television antenna systems excluding Com-
14 munity Antenna Television (C.A.T.V.) who performs no re-
15 pairs on television receivers.

1 SECTION 2. Said chapter 112, is hereby further amended
2 by striking out section 87RRR, as so appearing, inserting in
3 place thereof the following section: —

4 Except as otherwise provided, no person shall engage in the
5 business of or act as an antenna or radio and television tech-
6 nician directly or indirectly, unless he is licensed; provided,
7 however, that the board may, upon payment of a fee as

8 provided in section 87UUU, issue a learner's permit to an
9 applicant who submits a written statement made under oath
10 by a licensed master technician certifying that such person is
11 employed by him and will work directly under his supervision
12 and that he will be jointly responsible with him for work done
13 by the applicant. The Board may also, upon payment of a fee
14 as provided in section 87UUU, issue an apprentice antenna
15 permit to an applicant who submits a written statement made
16 under oath by a licensed antenna technician certifying that
17 such person is employed by him and will work directly under
18 his supervision and that he will be jointly responsible with him
19 for work done by the applicant. Each learner's permit must be
20 renewed yearly for a fee as provided in section 87UUU, and
21 shall be valid only while the holder is employed by the master
22 technician who submitted such certificate, and in no event for
23 more than three years. Each apprentice antenna permit must
24 be renewed yearly for a fee as provided in section 87UUU, and
25 shall be valid only while the holder is employed by the tech-
26 nician who submitted such certificate, and in no event for more
27 than two years.

28 Any sign, listing or other advertisement of a radio and
29 television technician shall contain his license number.

30 Nothing contained in this section shall be construed so as to
31 authorize a licensed radio and television technician to perform
32 any work or services which may only be performed by persons
33 licensed under chapter one hundred and forty-one.

34 The board shall make no rules or regulations which will be
35 in conflict with the provisions of chapter one hundred and
36 forty-one or with any rule or regulation adopted thereunder.

1 SECTION 3. Section 87SSS of said chapter 112, as so ap-
2 pearing, is hereby amended by striking out the last sentence
3 and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: —

4 Every license issued by the board shall expire December
5 thirty-first of each year and may be renewed within one year
6 after expiration, without examination, upon payment of the
7 renewal fee plus a late charge as provided in section 87UUU.

1 SECTION 4. Section 87TTT of said chapter 112, is hereby
2 further amended by striking out the first paragraph of section

3 87TTT, as so appearing, and inserting in place thereof the
4 following: —

5 Applications for licenses, signed and sworn to by the appli-
6 cant, shall be made on forms furnished by the board and shall
7 be accompanied by the prescribed fee for examination. Each
8 applicant shall furnish evidence of good moral character. No
9 license shall be issued unless evidence of good moral character,
10 as required by this section, is found.

1 SECTION 5. Section 87UUU of said chapter 112, as so ap-
2 pearing, is hereby amended by inserting after (d) the follow-
3 ing paragraphs: —

- 4 (e) For issuance of original shop license, ten dollars; for
5 renewal thereof, ten dollars.
6 (f) For issuance of original antenna license, ten dollars; for
7 renewal thereof, ten dollars.
8 (g) For issuance of original learner's permit, five dollars; for
9 renewal thereof, five dollars.
10 (h) For issuance of original apprentice antenna permit, five
11 dollars; for renewal thereof, five dollars.
12 (i) For a "Late Charge", ten dollars.

1 SECTION 6. Section 87VVV of said chapter 112, is hereby
2 further amended by striking out section 87VVV, as so appear-
3 ing, and inserting in place thereof the following: —

4 Whoever, violates any of section 87PPP through section
5 87TTT, inclusive, shall be punished by a fine of not less than
6 twenty-five dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, or by
7 imprisonment for not less than thirty days nor more than three
8 months, or both.
