## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

### AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING FIRE ALARM PROTECTION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 26B of chapter 148 of the General Laws,  
2 as most recently amended by chapter 214 of the acts of 1974,  
3 is hereby further amended by striking out, after the word  
4 Standard, the word "74" and inserting in place thereof the  
5 word: — 72.

1 SECTION 2. Be it further enacted that in order to secure this  
2 high standard of protection without imposing too great a  
3 financial burden on landlords, the state purchasing agent is  
4 hereby authorized to accept bids from fire alarm manufac-  
5 turers. The purchasing agent shall accept the bid and pur-  
6 chase ample supplies. The commonwealth, through its pur-  
7 chasing agent, shall make said alarms available to landlords  
8 at cost, plus ten percent.

**The Commemorative of Resolutions**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Two

ALL THE PROVISIONS HEREIN MADE AS ARE CONTAINED

IN IT ENACTED BY THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES IN SENATE  
 AND APPROVED, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Section 1 Section 224 of chapter 122 of the General Laws,  
 as most recently amended by chapter 224 of the acts of 1914,  
 is hereby further amended by striking out, after the word  
 "standing," the word "75," and inserting in place thereof the  
 word "72."

2. Section 2. No 11 further enacted that in order to secure this  
 high standard of protection without imposing too great a  
 financial burden on the State, the State purchasing agent is  
 hereby authorized to accept bids from the State mounting  
 thereon. The purchasing agent shall accept the bid and pay  
 thereon upon receipt. The commission through the pur-  
 chasing agent shall make said State available to ladies  
 at cost plus ten percent.
