**AN ACT PLACING CERTAIN PUBLIC EMPLOYEES IN GROUP 4 OF THE
CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 4, paragraph (g) of sub-division (2) of section 3 of
2 chapter 32 of the general laws as most recently amended by
3 chapter 809, acts of 1972, is hereby further amended by in-
4 serting after the word "ninety" in line three, the words,
5 "officials and employees of the commercial motor vehicle
6 division appointed by the chairman under section 12F, chap-
7 ter 25.

8 *Group 4.* Division of law enforcement, department of natural
9 resources; officials and employees of the registry of motor
10 vehicles appointed by the registrar under section twenty-nine
11 chapter ninety, and officials and employees of the commercial
12 motor vehicle division appointed by the chairman under section
13 12F, chapter 25, members of the state police detectives ap-
14 pointed under section six of chapter twenty-two, serving in
15 any division of the department of public safety, members of
16 the police force of the metropolitan district commission,
17 employees of the Massachusetts Port Authority at the General
18 Edward Lawrence Logan International Airport, comprising
19 permanent crash crewmen, fire control men, assistant fire con-
20 trol men, members of police and fire departments not classified
21 in *Group 1*, any police officer of the Massachusetts Bay Trans-
22 portation Authority, employees whose regular compensation
23 is paid by the United States from funds allocated to the

24 Massachusetts National Guard and who are regularly and
25 permanently employed under the control of the military
26 department of the commonwealth and whose duties in such
27 employment require substantially all normal working hours
28 and whose continued employment is based upon federal recog-
29 nition in the Massachusetts National Guard, employees of a
30 municipal gas or electric plant who are employed as linemen,
31 electric switchboard operators, electric maintenance men,
32 steam engineers, boiler operators, firemen, oilers, mechanical
33 maintenance men and supervisors of said employees and em-
34 ployees of the department of correction who are employed at
35 any correctional institution or prison camp under the control
36 of said department and who hold the position of correction
37 officer, female correction officer, industrial insrtuctor, recre-
38 ation officer, assistant industrial shop manager, assistant to
39 the supervisor of industries, supervisor of industries, senior
40 correction officer, senior female correction officer, supervising
41 correction officer, supervising female correction officer, prison
42 camp officer, senior prison camp officer, supervising prison
43 camp officer or assistant deputy superintendent.
