SENATE, January 6, 1975

1 *Ordered*, That a special committee of the senate be consti-  
2 tuted to consist of three members of the Senate to be appointed  
3 by the president of the senate to investigate and study the cur-  
4 riculum, courses, textbook selection, faculty hiring, assignment  
5 of students, tuition charges and educational and administrative  
6 policy of private secondary schools in the commonwealth.

7 Said special committee may hold hearings and require by  
8 summons the attendance and testimony of witnesses. Said  
9 special committee shall report to the general court from time  
10 to time of its investigation and study, and its recommenda-  
11 tions, if any, together with drafts of legislation to carry such  
12 recommendations into effect, and shall make a final report to  
13 the general court by filing the same with the clerk of the sen-  
14 ate on or before the last Wednesday in December, nineteen  
15 hundred and seventy-five.
