

SENATE No. 1779

By Mr. McKenna, a petition of Denis L. McKenna for legislation to avoid sole control by dental societies of dental service corporations. Insurance.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Five.

AN ACT TO AVOID SOLE CONTROL BY DENTAL SOCIETIES OF DENTAL SERVICE CORPORATIONS.

Whereas, the deferred operation of this Act would tend to defeat its purpose, therefore it is declared to be an emergency law needed for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first sentence in the first paragraph of section three
2 of General Law chapter one hundred seventy-six E as it
3 appears in chapter 714 of the acts of nineteen hundred sixty-
4 two is hereby amended by deleting the words: —

5 “that a majority of the directors shall at all times be persons
6 approved in writing by a dental society incorporated in the
7 commonwealth not less than ten years and having not less than
8 two thousand registered dentists as members, and”.
