AN ACT RELATIVE TO PERIODIC REVIEW OF AMBIENT AIR QUALITY STANDARDS.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purposes, which are to bring immediate economic relief to the consumers of the commonwealth from the spiraling costs of energy and other products due to the high cost of fuels, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Prior to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and seventy-six,
- 2 the department of public health or its successor shall not, in
- 3 taking any action pursuant to chapter four hundred and ninety-
- 4 four of the acts of nineteen hundred and seventy-four, be sub-
- 5 ject to the provisions of sections sixty-one and sixty-two of
- 6 chapter thirty of the General Laws.
