AN ACT ESTABLISHING A REVOLVING FUND FOR ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAMS ESTABLISHED BY SCHOOL COMMITTEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
- 2 after section 23 the following section:—
- 3 *Section 23A.* Every school committee may, in its discretion,
- 4 establish its adult education program on a self-supporting basis,
- 5 except as hereinafter provided. All receipts by the school
- 6 committee in connection with the conduct of such adult
- 7 education program shall be deposited with the treasurer of the
- 8 city or town, or in the case of a regional school district, with the
- 9 treasurer of such district, and held as a separate account and
- 10 expended by said school committee without further appropria-
- 11 tion, notwithstanding the provisions of section fifty-three of
- 12 chapter forty-four. Nothing contained herein shall prevent the
- 13 school committee from including in its annual budget a sum of
- 14 money necessary to pay for non-salary expenses of such program.
