AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE SUPPORT OF SCHOOLS BY THE TOWN OF MEDWAY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provision of section thirty-
2 four of chapter seventy-one of the General Laws, annual town
3 meetings of the town of Medway, on the approval of at least two-
4 thirds of the persons present and voting, may delete or reduce any
5 item in the school budget.

1 SECTION 2. The provisions of the last sentence of paragraph
2 two of section seven of chapter one hundred and fifty E of the
3 General Laws shall not apply to the town of Medway.
