AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE USE OF SCHOOL PROPERTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 71 of chapter 71 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by chapter 344 of the Acts of 1966, is hereby further
3 amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place
4 thereof the following two sentences: — For the purpose of
5 promoting the usefulness of public school property, the school
6 committee of any town may conduct such educational and
7 recreational activities in or upon school property under its
8 control. Subject to such regulations as the it may establish and
9 consistently and without interference with the use of the premises
10 for school purposes, the committee shall allow the use thereof by
11 individuals and associations for such educational, recreational,
12 social, civic, philanthropic and like purposes as it deems for the
13 interest of the community provided that all receipts by the
14 committee in connection with such use of school property for
15 such purposes provided for in this sentence shall be deposited
16 with the treasurer of such town and held as a separate account
17 and expended by said school committee without further
18 appropriation, notwithstanding the provisions of section fifty-
19 three of chapter forty-four.
