By Mr. Kuss of Fall River, petition of Matthew J. Kuss relative to authorizing the issuance of fishing licenses without charge to persons over the age of sixty-five. Natural Resources and Agriculture.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Six.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF FISHING LICENSES WITHOUT CHARGE TO PERSONS OVER THE AGE OF SIXTY-FIVE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The second paragraph of section 11 of chapter 131 of the  
2 General Laws, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 706 of the acts  
3 of 1972, is hereby amended by adding at the end the following  
4 words: — or over the age of sixty-five.

By the order of the House of Representatives,  
Resolved, That the Committee on the Judiciary  
do report the following bill, with amendments  
thereon, and a report thereon.

**The Constitution of the United States**

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators in that State.

Section 4. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State. The Electors shall meet in one or more States, and shall vote for all the Senators and Representatives to be chosen in that State.
