AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION IN MEDICINE TO REGISTER THOMAS G. S. YOUNG AS A QUALIFIED PHYSICIAN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of Section Three of Chapter
2 One Hundred and Twelve of the General Laws, the Board of
3 Registration in Medicine shall register Thomas G. S. Young as a
4 Physician; provided that Thomas G. S. Young furnishes evidence
5 to the Board, that he is a Registered Physician in the State of New
6 York and provided further that Thomas G. S. Young furnishes
7 the Board with certification from the Veterans Administration
8 Hospital in Vancouver, Washington, that said Thomas G. S.
9 Young satisfactorily served for a minimum period of five years as
10 physician on its staff, during which period he met all standards of
11 performance and duty imposed on a physician by the Hospital.
