AN ACT DEFINING THE TERM "COMMUTERS" IN THE LAW ESTABLISHING THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1 of chapter 161A of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by section 3 of chapter 578 of the Acts of 1969,
3 is hereby further amended by striking out the definition of
4 "Commuters" and inserting in place thereof the following
5 definition: — "Commuters", — All persons whose residence is in
6 one of the fourteen cities or towns or one of the sixty-four cities
7 or towns whose means of transport to and from their places of
8 work are owned, operated or subsidized by the Authority.
