In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Six.

AN ACT TO MANDATE THE KIND OF INFORMATION LABELED UPON PUBLIC GOODS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purposes of this act, 'public goods' shall
2 refer to any vehicle, machine, building, park or system comprised
3 of such goods.

1 SECTION 2. No public good requiring more than \$500 of
2 state, federal, or local tax monies may contain upon it nor may
3 any sign or message be posted in the immediate vicinity bearing
4 the name of an elected public official in the context of being
5 associated with such public good.

1 SECTION 3. Any public good which cost is greater than
2 \$25,000 must contain a breakdown written clearly on or in the
3 immediate vicinity of such good specifying
4 1. amount total taxes spent for project
5 2. amount private donation for the same.
6 3. federal, state, city breakdown
7 4. size of any operating budget secured for maintenance of the
8 public good.
