AN ACT REQUIRING FIRE INSURANCE COMPANIES TO CONTRIBUTE TO CERTAIN COSTS FOR FIRE PROTECTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 195 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
2 out the first sentence as appearing in Chapter 966 of the Acts of
3 1973 and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: —
4 Such sums for the expenses of the operation of training facilities
5 and curriculum for fire fighting personnel of the Massachusetts
6 Fire Fighting Academy, not to exceed five hundred thousand
7 dollars per year, as may be appropriated therefor, and for the
8 Boston Fire Fighting Academy, not to exceed \$200,000 per year
9 as may be appropriated therefor, shall be repaid to the
10 Commonwealth by insurance companies writing fire,
11 homeowners, multiple peril or commercial multiple peril policies
12 on property situated in the Commonwealth.
