## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Six.

AN ACT SETTING MANDATORY SENTENCES FOR COMMITTING CERTAIN FELONIES WHILE ARMED WITH A "SAWED-OFF" SHOTGUN.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Any person or persons convicted of a felony who, if during the
- 2 commission of said felony is armed with a weapon known as a
- 3 "sawed-off" shotgun must serve a sentence of 10 years
- 4 imprisonment for such first offense, 15 years imprisonment for
- 5 such second offense and life imprisonment for such third offense.
