**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Six.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR SENTENCING FOR CONVICTION OF USING A MOTOR VEHICLE WITHOUT AUTHORITY TO INCLUDE RESTITUTION TO THE OWNER OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 24 of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as amended, is  
2 hereby further amended by striking out in the second clause of  
3 paragraph (a) subdivision (2) the words "and whoever uses a  
4 motor vehicle without authority knowing that such use is  
5 unauthorized shall for the first offense, be punished by a fine of  
6 not less than fifty dollars nor more than five hundred dollars or  
7 by imprisonment for not less than thirty days nor more than two  
8 years, or both," and substituting in place thereof the words: —  
9 and whoever uses a motor vehicle without authority knowing that  
10 such is unauthorized, or steals from it or damages any of its parts  
11 or accessories, shall be punished for the first offense by a fifty  
12 dollar fine and by making restitution for any damages and  
13 inconvenience by loss of use of the vehicle to the owner,
