By Mr. Grenier of Spencer, petition of Henry R. Grenier that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles be authorized to issue distinctive number plates for certain disabled persons. Public Safety.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO ISSUING DISTINCTIVE NUMBER PLATES FOR
DISABLED PERSONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 The seventh paragraph of Section 2 of Chapter 90 of the
2 General Laws or most recently amended by Chapter 736 of the
3 Acts of 1967 is hereby further amended by striking the third
4 sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:—
5 The registrar may also furnish plates of a distinctive type or types
6 for a pleasure passenger vehicle owned and used by a blind person
7 or a person who has suffered the loss of use of one or both feet, or
8 of one or both hands or the foster parents of such blind or
9 disabled person and he may determine such standard of disability
10 and of qualification for the issuance of said plates as he deems
11 proper.
