RESOLVE FOR A MEMORIAL OR MONUMENT TO BE ERECTED TO THE MEMORY OF JAMES M. CURLEY FORMER GOVERNOR OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

1     *Resolved*, That a committee be appointed to pass on what  
2 form of public memorial or monument should be erected to the  
3 memory of James Michael Curley former Governor of the  
4 Commonwealth of Massachusetts: said committee to consist of  
5 two members to be appointed by his Excellency the Governor;  
6 three members of the Senate to be appointed by the President of  
7 the Senate and five members of the House of Representatives to  
8 be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.  
9     Said committee to recommend what expenditures should be  
10 set for the said memorial or monument.

11     Said committee to report its findings and recommendations,  
12 after hearings, to the General Court, by May fifteen, of 1976.
