The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Six.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR REIMBURSEMENT BY THE COMMONWEALTH TO CERTAIN CITIES AND TOWNS FOR COMPUTER CARDS USED IN ELECTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The commonwealth shall reimburse cities and towns which
- 2 use computerized voting systems for the cost of computer cards
- 3 and for the "mats" which are used in state primaries and
- 4 elections.
