AN ACT EXEMPTING CERTAIN VOLUNTEER SKI PATROLMEN FROM THE DEFINITION OF EMPLOYEE UNDER THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (4) of section 1 of chapter 152 of the General Laws,
2 as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 374 of the acts
3 of 1972, is hereby further amended by adding the following
4 paragraph:—

5 Employee shall not include any person performing voluntary
6 service as a ski patrolman who receives no compensation for such
7 services other than meals or lodging or the use of ski tow or ski
8 lift facilities or any combination thereof.
