

HOUSE No. 1468

By Mr. Chmura of Springfield, petition of the Department of Mental Health and the Savings Bank Association of Massachusetts that said department be authorized to lease premises for terms not exceeding ten years. State Administration.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Eight.

AN ACT PERMITTING THE DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH TO LEASE PREMISES FOR TERMS NOT EXCEEDING TEN YEARS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 10A of Chapter 8 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by section 37 of Chapter 757 of the Acts of 1962, is hereby
3 further amended by adding the following paragraph after the first
4 paragraph: —

5 Notwithstanding the time limitation and notice and proposal
6 requirements of this section or of any other provision of law, the
7 Department of Mental Health, subject to the foregoing approval,
8 may lease for a term not exceeding ten years premises in a building
9 not owned by the commonwealth for the purpose of establishing a
10 community based residential facility for the mentally ill or
11 mentally retarded to be operated under a contract with the
12 Department of Mental Health by a vendor who may be the lessor
13 of the premises.
