AN ACT AUTHORIZING A NEW METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION
POLICE DIVISION IN FOREST HILLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Metropolitan District Commission is hereby
2 authorized and directed to plan and establish a new police division
3 responsible for public safety and law enforcement in the area of the
4 City of Boston comprising the Jamaicaaway, Arborway, Morton
5 Street, Centre Street, V.F.W. Parkway and the proposed new
6 Greenbelt from Ruggles Street to Forest Hills.

1 SECTION 2. The M.D.C. shall construct suitable quarters in
2 the Forest Hills area for the police division authorized in Section 1.

By Mr. Chairman of Senate, passage of James J. Cannon, Jr., and another that the Mississippi River Commission be directed to conduct a new survey of the lower Mississippi River and to report thereon to the Senate.

The Commission of the Mississippi River

Is the Year One of the Commission's Work

The Act establishing a new Mississippi River Commission for the purpose of conducting a new survey of the lower Mississippi River and of reporting thereon to the Senate.

It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Commission of the Mississippi River be organized on the first day of July, 1914.

SECTION 1. The Mississippi River Commission is hereby established and authorized to conduct a new survey of the lower Mississippi River and to report thereon to the Senate. The Commission shall also be authorized to conduct such other surveys and investigations as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of determining the best method of improving the navigation of the lower Mississippi River. The Commission shall also be authorized to acquire, lease, or otherwise obtain such lands, waters, or interests in lands and waters as may be necessary for the purpose of conducting the survey and investigations authorized by this section.

SECTION 2. The M. R. C. shall consist of six members to be appointed by the President, two of whom shall be appointed in Council.
