RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF WILLIAM R. DWYER AN EMPLOYEE OF THE METROPOLITAN STATE HOSPITAL.

1 *Resolved*, That, for the purpose of discharging a moral
2 obligation of the Commonwealth, and after an appropriation has
3 been made therefor, there shall be allowed and paid out of the State
4 Treasury to William R. Dwyer, of Belmont, Massachusetts, or
5 inasmuch as said William R. Dwyer, who while an employee of the
6 Commonwealth at the Metropolitan State Hospital, was
7 wrongfully separated from his position as a stationary engineer in
8 May of 1976, and denied due process of law attendant thereto, and
9 further denied unemployment benefits, and was unable to be
10 otherwise employed because of said separation from May 25, 1976
11 until February 14, 1977, at which time pursuant to an Order,
12 Judgement and Decree of the Superior Court, and by Agreement
13 of the Commonwealth acting through the Department of the
14 Attorney General said William R. Dwyer was reinstated to his
15 former position, but reduced in grade from stationary engineer to
16 stationary fireman, and without back pay or attorneys fees.

17 The appropriation first referred to above shall be in the amount
18 of Nine Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-Five Dollars and
19 Seventy-Five Cents (\$9,875.75), for loss of wages and benefits and
20 legal services.
