By Mr. Doyle of Boston, petition of Charles Robert Doyle that persons sixty-five years of age and older be granted free transportation on the facilities of the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority. Transportation.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Eight.

AN ACT DIRECTING THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY TO CHARGE ALL PERSONS SIXTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER NO FEE ON ITS RAPID TRANSIT AND SURFACE LINES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 5 of chapter 161A of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out subsection (e 1/2) and inserting in place  
3 thereof the following subsection: —

4 (e 1/2) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section or of  
5 section fifteen of chapter one hundred fifty-nine of the General  
6 Laws, the Authority shall not charge persons sixty-five years and  
7 older who reside in a city or town comprising the territory of said  
8 Authority any fare for transportation on its rapid transit lines and  
9 on its surface lines.
