

ACTS, 1982. - Chaps. 584, 585.

Chap. 584. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE INDEMNIFICATION FOR MEDICAL EXPENSES OF CERTAIN RETIRED POLICE OFFICERS AND FIREFIGHTERS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 100B of chapter 41 of the General Laws, as appearing in chapter 317 of the acts of 1972, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "meeting", in line 6, the words:- or a special town meeting.

Chap. 585. AN ACT FURTHER DEFINING THE AUTHORITY OF THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BRISTOL COUNTY AND THE SELECTMEN OF THE TOWN OF DARTMOUTH TO IMPLEMENT CERTAIN PROVISIONS IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF A CORRECTIONAL FACILITY IN SAID COUNTY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, the county commissioners of Bristol county may take by eminent domain, after a public hearing or acquire by purchase or otherwise any land and buildings that may be necessary for the purpose of constructing a new jail or house of correction, including all land necessary for access to such site or existing sewer lines to service such site, provided that title to any land and buildings acquired by the county by eminent domain or otherwise for such purpose shall be transferred to the commonwealth under the provisions of chapter three hundred and forty-seven of the acts of nineteen hundred and eighty-two and the regulations promulgated thereunder if a grant is authorized under said chapter three hundred and forty-seven to acquire the land and any buildings thereon, or to construct, design, plan, reconstruct, rehabilitate, renovate, modernize, finish or expand a correctional facility located on said land. After the completion of such facility, as provided for in said chapter three hundred and forty-seven the facility shall be operated and maintained by the county as a county house of correction.

SECTION 2. The county may use funds awarded by the secretary of human services under chapter three hundred and forty-seven of the acts of nineteen hundred and eighty-two for the acquisition of land, including any buildings located thereon, for a jail, house of correction or other county correctional facility, as set forth in section one, and for the construction, design, planning, reconstruction, rehabilitation, renovation, modernization, completion, demolition or expansion of a county correctional facility or for the purchasing of equipment and furnishings for such facility. In addition, the county is authorized to service said correctional facility from the existing sanitary sewer located along Faunce Corner road in the town of Dartmouth, and to use the above mentioned funds for any land acquisition, designs or construction necessary for such purpose, regardless of whether the extension of the existing sewer by the town of Dartmouth, as provided in section five of chapter three hundred and forty-seven of the acts of nineteen hundred and eighty-two, has been completed.

SECTION 3. Section 5 of chapter 347 of the acts of 1982 is hereby amended by striking out the third paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following two paragraphs:-

When in making the grants authorized by this section, if the secretary approves a grant for the acquisition of land, the planning and construction of a jail in the town of Dartmouth, the secretary shall also approve a grant of not less than eight million four hundred thousand dollars for the design and construction of an interceptor sewer to service the facilities on the property where the facility is to be constructed, and to include the design and construction for an addition to the present sewerage treatment plant, and the interceptor sewerage needs of that section of the town of Dartmouth along Faunce Corner Road, through which the interceptor sewer runs, including the acquisition of such additional land and interests therein as may be necessary for the installation of said interceptor sewer, by purchase, by eminent domain under chapter seventy-nine of the General Laws, or otherwise; provided, that no payment shall be made for the acquisition of such additional land and interests therein until three independent appraisals of the value of the property has been made by qualified disinterested appraisers; and provided further, however, that notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, any land taken by eminent domain proceedings or any interest therein so taken for jail purposes under this section which are determined to be not needed for said purposes, shall be conveyed by the commonwealth to the town of Dartmouth industrial development commission.

Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the secretary of human services is authorized to provide grant funds to the town of Dartmouth, upon application by the selectmen of the town, for the design and construction of the interceptor sewer and the addition to the sewerage treatment plant, and for the acquisition of such land and interests therein as may be necessary for the installation of the interceptor sewer.

SECTION 4. Chapter four hundred and twelve of the acts of nineteen hundred and seventy-three is hereby repealed.

Chap. 586. **AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE PROCEDURE
RELATIVE TO VIOLATIONS OF MOTOR VEHICLE
LAWS.**

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section twenty F of chapter ninety is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. The General Laws are hereby amended by striking out chapter ninety C and inserting in place thereof the following chapter:-

CHAPTER 90C.
PROCEDURE FOR MOTOR VEHICLE OFFENSES.

Section 1. In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, the following words shall have the following meanings:-

"Audit sheet", a sheet of paper which shall contain a list of the issuance and disposition of each citation in each citation book in such form as the registrar shall approve, and which shall include, but need not be limited to, the following information: the police department or organization to which the citation book was issued, the offense, the name and address of the offender, the name of the issuing officer and the disposition.

"Automobile law violation", any violation of any statute, ordinance, by-law or regulation relating to the operation or control of motor vehicles other than a violation (1) of any rule, regulation, order, ordinance or by-law regulating the parking of motor vehicles established by any city or town or by any commission or
