AN ACT PERMITTING PUBLICATION OF NAMES OF CERTAIN JUVENILES ADJUDICATED DELINQUENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 119 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
2 after section 60A the following section: —

3 *Section 60B.* It shall be unlawful to publish the names of persons
4 before the court in any hearing under sections fifty-two to seventy-
5 two A, inclusive, provided however, that names and other identify-
6 ing information of any juvenile who has previously been adjudi-
7 cated delinquent of any offense may be published on a second or
8 subsequent adjudication of delinquency.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

But no Representative shall be chosen until two Years after the first Meeting of the new State, and he shall, when elected, have seven Years to continue one Term; but he shall be eligible for another Term after the first Year. No Person shall be Representative of any State unless he shall, when elected, have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and seven Years shall have elapsed since the Emigration of such Person from the State in which he shall be chosen.
