

By Mrs. Gray of Framingham, petition of Barbara E. Gray and John H. Loring that the fees for hunting, fishing and trapping licenses conform to the federal regulations concerning citizenship. Natural Resources and Agriculture.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Nine.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE FEES FOR HUNTING, FISHING AND TRAPPING LICENSES CONFORM TO THE FEDERAL REGULATIONS CONCERNING CITIZENSHIP.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 11 of Chapter 131 of the General Laws, as appearing in
2 Section 1 of Chapter 420 of the Acts of 1974, is hereby amended by
3 striking out paragraphs two, three, four and five, inclusive, and
4 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: —
5 Sporting, hunting, fishing and trapping licenses shall be issued
6 of the classification of the individual upon payment of the appro-
7 priate fee. The fee for such licenses shall be as follows: — a sporting
8 license, thirteen dollars and fifty cents; a hunting license, eight
9 dollars and twenty-five cents; a fishing license, eight dollars and
10 twenty-five cents, except for such license issued to a minor fifteen
11 to seventeen years of age, inclusive, the fee shall be six dollars and
12 twenty-five cents. No fee shall be charged for any license issued
13 under this paragraph to a person over the age of seventy, or for a
14 fishing or hunting license issued under this paragraph to a para-
15 plegic, or for a fishing license issued under this paragraph to a
16 person who is blind or mentally retarded.
