AN ACT FURTHER INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF EXEMPTION TO WHICH OWNERS OF ESTATES ARE ENTITLED.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of Chapter 188 of the General Laws, as
2 most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 392 of the acts of
3 1978, is hereby amended by striking out the word "forty" by
4 inserting thereof the word "fifty".

1 SECTION 2. Section 9 of said chapter 188 is hereby amended
2 by striking out the word "forty", inserted by section 2 of chapter
3 392 of the acts of 1978, and inserting in place thereof the word:
4 "fifty".

1 SECTION 3. Section 21 of chapter 209 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out the word "forty", inserted by
3 section 3 of said chapter 392 and inserting in place thereof the
4 word: "fifty".

1 SECTION 4. Chapter 236 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the word "forty" as appears in lines four
3 and six and eight as most recently amended by section 4 of chapter
4 392 and inserting in place thereof the word: "fifty".

1 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect as of January 1, 1979.
