AN ACT CLARIFYING THE OBLIGATIONS OF NATIONAL POLITICAL COMMITTEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 6 of Chapter 55 of the General Laws as most recently
2 amended by Chapter 775 of the Acts of 1975, is hereby further
3 amended by adding at the end of the first paragraph thereof the
4 following:—

5 No national political committee shall make a campaign contri-
6 bution unless at the time such contribution is made there is also
7 made known to the person receiving such contribution the names
8 and addresses of its principal officers, and such names and
9 addresses are conveyed to the director of the office of campaign
10 finance and the chairmen on the ethics commission.
